



P. A. Leason's frontispiece to Edward Bellamy, *Looking Backward: 2000-1887*, Sydney: Socialist Labor Party, 1942










- "utopia"

  - outopia (ou-topos), meaning "no place"
- Utopia a good place
  - Presented as better than the author's present
  - Not necessarily perfect not a heaven
- Dystopia a bad place
  - Presented as worse than the author's present
