MONASH ARTS: AN ARC SUCCESS STORY


For two years running **Monash Arts** has been the top performing Faculty nationally in the Australian Research Council (ARC) Grant Schemes, with 39 ARC projects awarded to the Faculty since 2018.

In 2019 alone, 25 projects were awarded to **Monash Arts** in the ARC schemes, amounting to a total research income of **\$14,311,205**. This includes 1 Australian Laureate Fellowship, 2 Future Fellowships, 5 Discovery Early Career Researcher Awards (DECRA), 1 Linkage Project, an ARC Centre of Excellence node, and 15 Discovery Projects (DP).


Monash Arts achieved the top position in the country for DPs and DECRAs in 2019 in 'Humanities and Social Sciences'. In particular, Monash led the FOR 16 code in the DP20 round. In the DP19 round, **Monash Arts** topped the country in the disciplines of History and Philosophy.

The Faculty of Arts led the G08 in Humanities and Social Sciences (HASS) in both ARC Discovery Projects and DECRA schemes:

HASS DP 2020: Go8 COMPARISON




HASS DECRA 2020: Go8 COMPARISON




One of the driving factors in our ARC success was to encourage increased participation from our researchers in ARC schemes.

In 2019, there were 78 submissions to various ARC schemes from the Faculty. This was the 4th largest ARC submission from Monash, and dwarfed the 2017 and 2018 submissions of 50 and 55, respectively.

Our 2020 submission currently features 4 Laureates, as well as over 65 other applications (LP's, DP's, FT's, DE's).



The increased volume of **quality** applications has led to higher levels of success.





MONASH ARTS STRATEGIES FOR SUCCESS

- Early identification of competitive bids via a rigorous Expression of Interest process involving the ADR, Heads of School and School Research Coordinators
- Keeping researchers engaged in project development through regular workshops and information sessions
- Strategies around retention to sustain volume of submissions
- Targeted workshops strategically aimed at particular sections of the proposal. E.g. first-page workshop, project design and methodology workshop
- One-to-one mentoring
- Strategic review and feedback on proposals

For Future Fellowships and DECRA, our approach has been to select the most competitive candidates via a rigorous EOI process.


The selected applicants were given comprehensive support to develop their proposals, including one-to-one mentoring and feedback.
